Re: Executive Principal at Montgomery

May I introduce myself to you as the Executive Principal of Montgomery. It is a role I am really looking forward to. I will still be Headteacher at Millfield, but myself and Mr Stephen Careless who will be the Principal at Montgomery from September are looking forward to leading the school forward to further improvements.

Already under the leadership of Mr Nicholson the school has moved its' OFSTED judgement from a "4" to a "3". The next stage of the journey is to make Montgomery a consistently "good" school, that strives for quality and excellence in all it does.

I have been a teacher on the Fylde Coast for my entire teaching career. I have moved from Hodgson to Carr Hill, to St. George's, to Lytham, to Millfield, and now I come as Executive Principal to Montgomery.

On appointment, at Millfield we managed to remove the grade 4 judgement from the school.
