Dear Parent/Carer,

I am writing with an update of the current situation at Montgomery in regards to Covid cases and associated restrictions. Also, I have included our end of term arrangements later in the letter.

At the end of school on Friday we had 14 current positive cases, half of which were in Year 7; down from 45 cases two weeks ago. This is a much-improved situation and down to students, parents and staff working together on face masks, Lateral Flow Testing and adhering to the 'minor symptoms' guidance introduced from 23<sup>rd</sup> November.

I discussed our current restrictions with Public Health on Friday. In particular the 'minor symptoms' policy in place at the moment, which is having an impact on the attendance of some students. Another factor to consider is the prevalence of the norovirus in the community, which has led to the closure of one local school this week. In light of this, we agreed that we would **continue** with our current restrictions, which are clearly having a positive impact in maintaining face-to-face learning as much as we possibly can at the moment.

We are using a sizeable amount of disposable face masks each day, creating a huge amount of waste. Therefore, we have purchased more fabric masks to reduce the waste. Each student will be issued with a fabric mask on Monday morning, if they do not have one themselves. Please ask your son or daughter to keep it in their school bag or uniform, so they have it each day and don't require a disposable one.

**Today** is the next day for supervising your son or daughter to complete their latest Lateral Flow Test.

We feel that students coming in to school before having been tested defeats the object of the process. We are still making final decisions in regard to the start of next term, so will communicate again before the end of term.

## Omicron variant isolation period

You may have seen that there are different government guidelines in place for any identified cases of the Omicron variant. The first few cases of this new variant have already been found in the North West. Unlike the guidance for other variants, any close contact of a positive Omicron case do need to self-isolate for 10 days, whether or not they have been double vaccinated. This is similar to the situation earlier in the year with the previous variants. If this new variant spreads quickly, as is expected, this could have a further impact on both student and staff attendance levels in the new year or possibly before. This is why adhering to all the Covid-secure restrictions currently in place are so important in maintaining your child's education.

As ever, thank you for your fantastic support in keeping the majority of students learning in school, as well as the small proportion who are not learning remotely.
